## **223. USE OF BICYCLES AND MOTOR VEHICLES**

### **Purpose**

The Board regards the use of bicycles and motor vehicles for travel to and from school by students as an assumption of responsibility by parents/guardians and students.

### **Authority**

The Board will permit the use of bicycles by students in accordance with the rules of the district.

The Board will permit the use of motor vehicles by secondary students in accordance with the rules of the district provided that such students:

1. Are licensed drivers;
2. Have parental permission when they are minors; and
3. Have been granted permission by the building principal to drive a motor vehicle on school grounds.

The Board will not be responsible for bicycles and motor vehicles which are lost, stolen, or damaged.

### **Delegation of Responsibility**

The building principal or designee shall develop rules and regulations for the operation and parking of bicycles and motor vehicles and shall disseminate those rules to affected students.

Students may park only in the areas provided for student parking. Improper parking, such as wrong area, blocking roadway, straddling lines, is prohibited. Campus speed shall not be in excess of ten (10) miles per hour.

Vehicles must be driven at all times so as to provide maximum protection for the safety of other people and their property.

Students are not permitted to drive vehicles and/or transport other students to and from any off-campus event planned and/or sponsored by the school.

Under certain circumstances, the high school principal or designee may permit individual students to drive themselves to the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center. Prior to granting such permission, the principal or designee shall determine if there is good reason for the student to drive to the Center, if the student's parents or guardian(s) want the student to drive to the Center, and if the student's parents or guardian(s) are willing to assume full responsibility for his/her safety and welfare while driving to and from the Center. Under no conditions shall the student driver be permitted to transport other students to and from the Center.

The privilege of parking and/or driving on the campus or permission to drive to and from the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center may be withdrawn from any student who violates this policy or any related school rules.
